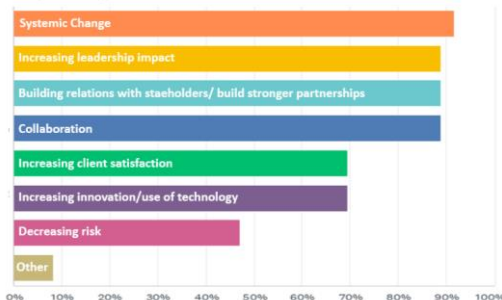

3. Adjustments to the CLP Nigeria website for more effective use: mobile-friendliness, immediate and agile access to documents

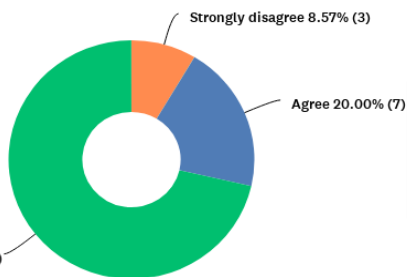

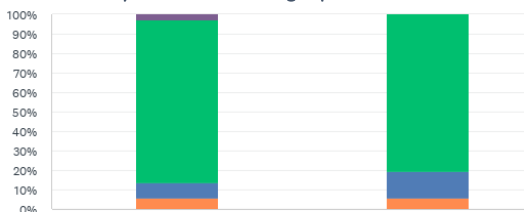
